Would you like to advertise your events for free? Would you like to support local people to find care and support services in their community? We have been advised of a service called Somerset Choices.

Somerset Choices is a website that contains a directory of local events and services. You can sign up and add your events, and details of your community groups and services to the website - it is quick, easy and there is help at hand.

The aim of the website is for Somerset families to find out where they can find local services and information about local events. For almost a year the website has been live. It has been focussed on adults' services but it is being expanded to include children's services.

The website is only as strong as the content it contains and they want to make it as useful as it can possibly be. For example, if someone wants to find a toddler group, a support group, a social club or simply wants to contact someone to book local facilities they can use this website.

This is an opportunity for you to publicise the services you offer and to encourage other providers within your community to become involved as well.
